Subject:-Grant of Conditional Permission to Bhartiya Ayurvedic Medical College, At Village-Kudena, Gajraula J.P. Nagar, Amroha-244235, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0508) for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and relevant regulations thereunder-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government notified that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. In view of the above the Central Government constituted the Autonomous Boards with effect from 11th June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder. Further, the provisions of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provisions of NCISM Act 2020 shall not be applicable.

- 1. It is pertinent to mention here that considering the request of the college to reduce intake capacity in UG course from 100 seats to 60 seats with reference to letter no. BAMC/2022/152 dated 24,03,2022, for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course has been considered here. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Bhartiya Ayurvedic Medical College, At Village-Kudena, Gajraula J.P. Nagar, Amroha-244235, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0508) inspection of your College was conducted on 11.10.2022 to 12.10.2022 on hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and relevant regulations
- 2. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under, and on the basis of Relaxation policy issued by the NCISM dated 16.03.2022. On examining the same certain deficiencies were observed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM).
- 3. As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the 23rd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 06.12.2022. On careful examination of the assessment report it was found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria for issuing of Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2022-23 and Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to your college. Thereafter, an opportunity of hearing was granted to your college on 12.12.2022 to present the case through virtual mode.
- 4. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, (NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 24th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 16.12.2022. Board verified the same and found that the College is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for grant of Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23.

- 5. In view of above, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine to issue Conditional Permission to Bhartiya Ayurvedic Medical College, At Village-Kudena, Gajraula J.P. Nagar, Amroha-244235, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0508) for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23, subject to following condition:-
 - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2022-23 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
 - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 8. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2022 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2023-24:
 - i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;

i) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian

Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);

- iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
- 9. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2023-24.
